Where do we go from here?

I hope you've all had a chance to read the Annual Report for 2017 and particularly the accounts and my remarks. People have already told me that they found the "Summary" of the accounts easier to understand than the accounts in full, so I shall continue with that in future years. They have also told me that the daily rates quoted on the summary came as a shock to them, and I have to admit they surprised me too.

So, the obvious question is "what can we do about the fact that we, as the church, contribute only just over half what it costs to keep up this building where we meet together in love and friendship to worship God, to bring our troubles to Him and be re-assured, to thank Him for all his goodness towards us and to welcome all others who wish to do the same and get to know Him better"?

As you might imagine, we talked a lot about this at the Annual Meeting and one idea put forward was that we should all consider increasing our giving by £1.00 per week. Assuming an average attendance of 30 each week, this would raise an additional £1,560 which would be very welcome and would reduce the current necessity of drawing on our reserves, so can we all please give that some prayerful thought.

Another idea was to increase the use of the Church Envelope Scheme. Many members use this already, but more would be welcome.

It works like this:

- At the beginning of the year you are given a booklet of 52 envelopes, one for each week.
- Your offering is put into the envelope and then into the collection plate as it comes around.
- If you miss a Sunday or more than one, you still put your offering in the appropriate envelope and bring them all next time you come. I call this the "All-Bran" system because it keeps us regular in our giving and also reminds us that the Church expenses continue whether we are there or not. If you would like to join the Envelope Scheme, and you can join at any time, please talk to me.

Another way, of course, is by regular transfer from your Bank to ours and I hope to have the relevant forms soon, so again, please talk to me.

As you will have seen from the Summary, we have somewhat of a problem, but I would like to think that, with God's help, we can overcome it. After all, we are only giving back to God what He has already given us.

KWA MKONO NEWS

May 2018

It has been a busy time at the centre for the last 6 months. The building of the 2 new dormitories that were

started when Lesley and Keith visited in October last year were finished in January, the beds and cupboards are now made and they are ready for the new children who started to arrive in March. Over the next few months the number of children resident at the centre will increase to 68 and with those at Hegongo school and teacher training college there will be 75 disabled young people. The girl's laundry had to be demolished to make way for the new dormitory, it was one of the original buildings and as it had not been updated it was in need of major repair and enlarging so when the rains have stopped later this month or early June a new laundry will be built.



In the valley the borehole now has a lockable lid and is inside a small brick building with a concrete floor surrounding it to stop vandalism and allow the Centre to access the water. A 2,500 litre bowser, petrol powered pump and hoses to fill the bowser so that it can be towed by the tractor has been purchased, so the Centre can collect water during the dry season.

The rains have been good this year so the Centre should get a good harvest. At the shamba (farm) maize, peas and cassava has been planted. In the grounds round the Centre vegetables are being grown and with the borehole water available they will get 3 or 4 crops a year producing most of its needs for the children. Unfortunately, the heavy rain has caused some damage and we recently received an e mail saying that one of the cesspits had collapsed and the trust had to send emergency funds to have it repaired.

Things for the children to do after school are important especially during the rainy season. In the hall a cupboard has educational games to help the young children with letters, numbers, colours and jigsaws, board games and books for the older ones. Enoch, who was a child at the centre for several years, supervises the children helping them with homework and teaches computing to those who can read basic



English. Outside there is a play area where ball games can be played there are swings, a slide, see-saw and just installed a roundabout which is proving very popular with the children.

The trust funds are depleted because we have sent money to repair the cesspit.
